



Liberty House is 15 years old! *Celebrating the Accomplishments of a Community*

On April 6, 2014, Liberty House will mark fifteen years since opening its doors and beginning to see patients. It is a milestone that provides a wonderful opportunity to honor all those who turned a vision into a reality: a model for responding to concerns of abuse and neglect in a way that would be better for children and would help families get the support they need with fewer appointments and more coordination. Liberty House facilitates a community-based, multidisciplinary approach to respond and prevent child abuse and neglect. Our community thrives when our partnerships are strong, so this year is a year to celebrate those partnerships and see our collective accomplishments as a springboard for becoming even more effective, now and in the future.

How will we mark this special year? **We will start with a special 15th Anniversary Dinner and Recognition Ceremony on Tuesday, April 1, 2014, 6:00-8:00 pm** at the Grand Ballroom in Salem. We will honor our founding partners, share stories, and recognize community leaders who were instrumental in developing and shepherding the vision. We will also recognize the achievement of all dedicated community partners, volunteers, and other individuals and organizations who continue to work together to respond to and prevent child abuse. If you are not very familiar with Liberty House, this will be a great opportunity to hear the story of why it began. This dinner will also be a good way to kick off April as Child Abuse Prevention Month.

We will hold our signature auction, **Chefs for Liberty House, on Sunday, June 8, 2014 at Willamette University's Putnam Center.** This terrific evening of gourmet dining will offer some spectacular bidding opportunities as well as the chance to socialize with your friends in Willamette's beautiful setting. In September, plan on joining us at noon for our annual **Champions for Children Luncheon, Tuesday, September 23, 2014 at the Salem Convention Center.** This opportunity to hear moving personal stories and learn how through working together, our outstanding community partners help children get to a place where trauma no longer holds them back from living the life they want to live will serve as an inspiration for all of us. Finally, the Board of Directors will host a **Holiday Soirée at the new Gayle's City Market in downtown Salem on Thursday, December 4, 2014** to cap off the year and get your holiday season off to a swinging start.

We hope you will join us for as many of these special events as possible!

Recognizing the wonderful fabric of our greater community, this year we are reaching out in several new ways. Specially trained child interviewers also help children talk about what has happened to them in a neutral and sensitive manner to ensure the objectivity of the assessment and the wellbeing of the child.

CEO NOTES

The Power of Connecting to Others

I was visiting with a friend recently. One thing I noticed about that conversation was how deeply my friend was concentrating on what I was saying. It wasn't the first time; she is consistently that way in our conversations. It is probably one of the main reasons we became friends in the first place. Her habit of focusing all of her attention on me when we visit makes me feel very special. When I am with her, I try to do the same. It means that our conversations are very warm and our hearts connect in a special way. When our visits conclude and I begin the next part of my day, I take that warmth with me, and it becomes part of what I give to others.

When children and their families come to Liberty House, they receive our full attention in a similar way. One of the services we offer is an interview, during which the child will spend time with someone who has received special training in that type of conversation. The interview is held in a room that is quiet and designed to feel comfortable, so nothing will distract the interviewer from focusing his or her full attention on the child. The environment makes it safe for the child to talk about his or her experiences to a person who is able to receive the conversation neutrally and without judgment or reaction. It helps the child to connect to someone who knows how to navigate a very sensitive conversation.

Another service that we offer is a head-to-toe medical checkup by a pediatrician or physician's assistant who has had special training. Particularly for children who haven't received regular medical care, the checkup helps the child to feel more comfortable and can help relieve anxiety. If you have ever been to the doctor and felt that your doctor was listening carefully to what you were saying, you will be able to understand how reassuring that must feel to a child. There is a connection there that is very important. Connection also happens in another way: for children who have primary care providers, our team helps connect them back to their doctors for follow up.

We also offer support to parents who bring their children to Liberty House. Our experienced family support team focuses on what the parent is expressing, listens with compassion, and offers support and resources to help the parent navigate challenging terrain. When parents can connect with someone who is completely focused on their needs, and can get connected to follow up resources, it gives them what they need to move forward.

Connecting is powerful. It is what we do. It can help children and families get to a place where the trauma they might have experienced no longer has power over them. Connecting builds safety and warmth that extends from one conversation to the next. I hope you know how grateful we are for the support you provide to all of us at Liberty House. You are the reason we are able to do what we do. As we try to give strength to others, you give us strength through your encouragement, your support, your volunteering, and your contributions.

community about the mission of Liberty House and learn about ways to get involved. We will launch a **Men's Team** to spearhead our CEO's College Football Challenge and volunteer to work in small groups to do various projects to help with facility upkeep and routine maintenance throughout the year. Finally, we are developing a **Children's Giving Project** to provide an opportunity for children to contribute items identified on our **Wish List**, either individually or in connection with a special day such as a birthday.

Now that we have reached the fifteen year mark, it is crucial for us to work with our close partners such as the District Attorney's Office, law enforcement agencies, schools, medical providers and facilities, and the Department of Human Services to look toward the future. To help us get there, we are conducting a **Community Needs Assessment** to identify what are the greatest challenges in responding to and investigating child abuse and neglect cases, and how might Liberty House prioritize its services to provide the greatest value for our partners. We look forward to sharing what we learn and how the information will guide our board, staff, and multiple partners toward becoming even more effective for the children we serve. Stay tuned! We are focused on being as effective as we can for the most vulnerable children in our community so their futures can be brighter. It will be a good year. ★

Ways to Support Liberty House

DINE IN THE MID VALLEY is more than a celebration of the Valley's growing food scene; it allows restaurants to show off their talents and share their story.
