

Liberty House Covid-19 Response & Prevention

We want you to know that Liberty House is taking a number of steps to keep staff members and guests safe and healthy. It is important for all of us to do what we can to prevent the spread of coronavirus and Covid-19, the disease it causes.

As of May 18, 2020

- We are sanitizing all work areas and work surfaces frequently throughout the day.
- We are limiting the number of persons who come into any Liberty House facility.
- Staff members who are able to work from home are working from home to the greatest degree possible.
- All staff members who come to work are screening themselves for fever, upper respiratory illness, other symptoms associated with Covid-19, out of state travel, and exposure to anyone who has Covid-19 symptoms, has tested positive, or has traveled out of state (including internationally). If any of these factors are present, the staff members do not come to work.
- All staff members who are onsite working in a Liberty House building are wearing protective face masks when they are in lobbies, hallways, common areas, and when they are unable to maintain social distancing such as when they may be doing a medical examination. Clinical team members (who are around the most members of the public) change their clothes at the end of their shift before going home. All staff members who come onsite wash and sanitize their hands frequently.
- We are providing additional office space for staff members in order to reduce the number of persons in any given area, and we will explore staggered schedules as needed.
- Vendors or other guests who must come into a Liberty House building (i.e. for deliveries) are instructed to wear a protective face mask and not to enter the building if they have any of the symptoms noted above or have been exposed to anyone who has.
- The Clinic is still receiving referrals and scheduling patients who need to be seen and ensuring that children who are unwell are not scheduled until their symptoms are gone.
- The Hope & Wellness team members are seeing their clients via teletherapy.
- The Prevention team is providing trainings online.
- We have temporarily stopped receiving certain types of donations.
- We have temporarily stopped allowing volunteers to come onsite in order to protect their health.

We are committed to the health and safety of our clients, patients, staff members, volunteers, vendors and partners! We will make the best decisions we can based upon guidance from the State of Oregon OHA, Governor's Office, and the CDC. We hope you are well and encourage you to take all necessary steps to stay well!
